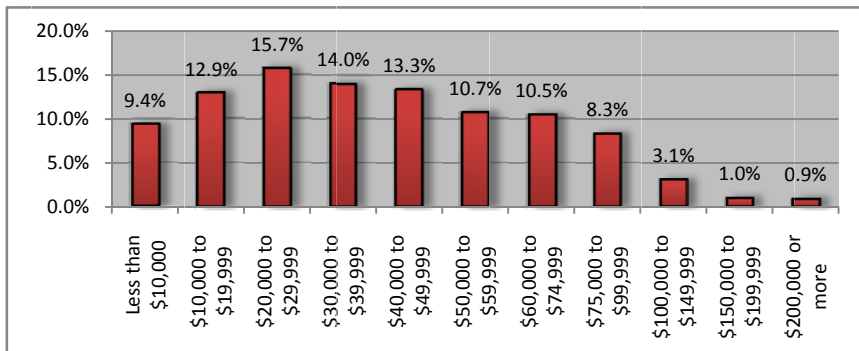

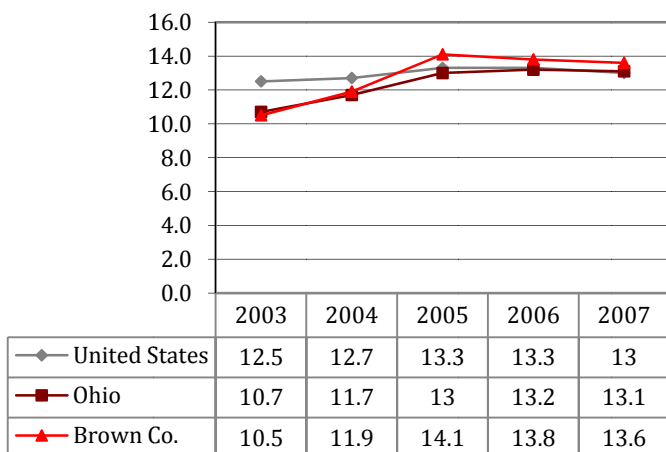

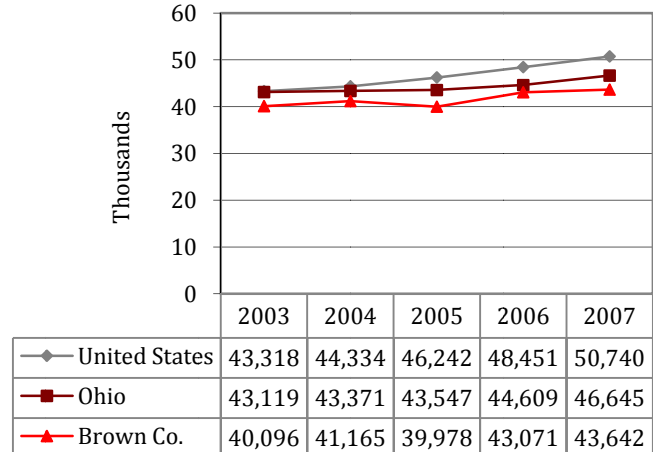
Percent of Population by Household Income³

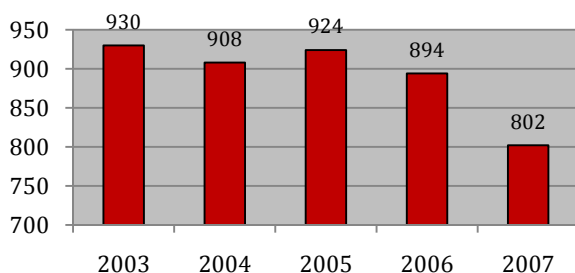

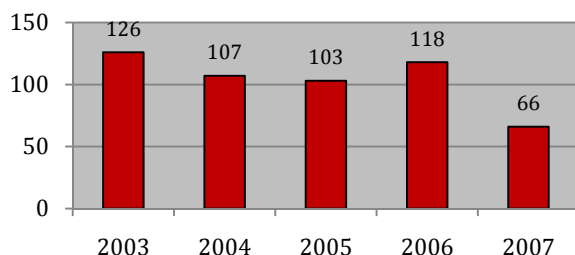

Number of Business Starts

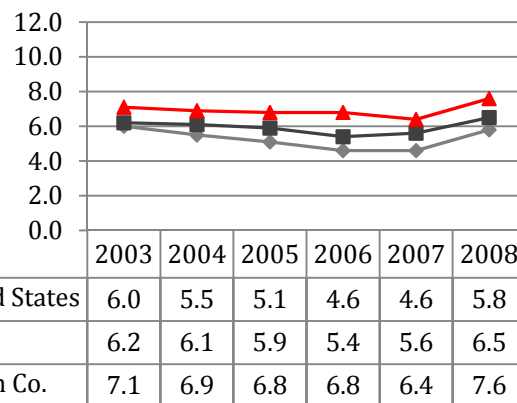

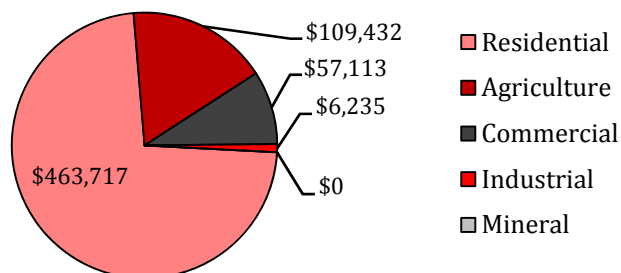

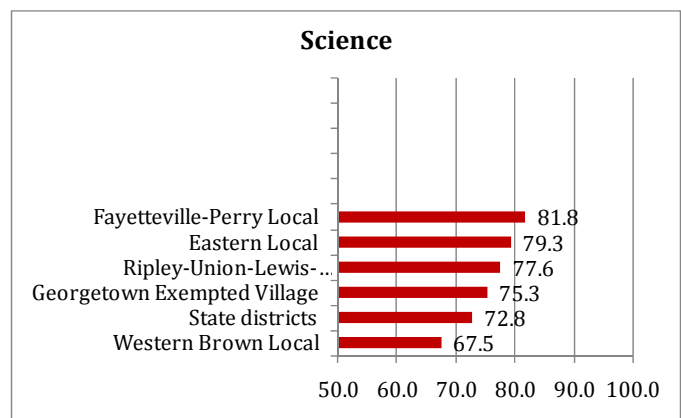
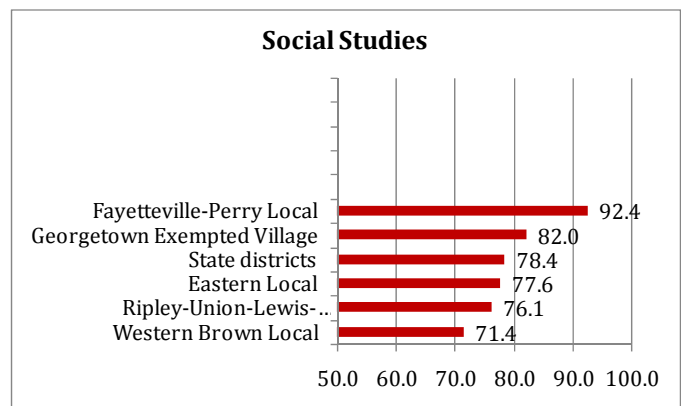
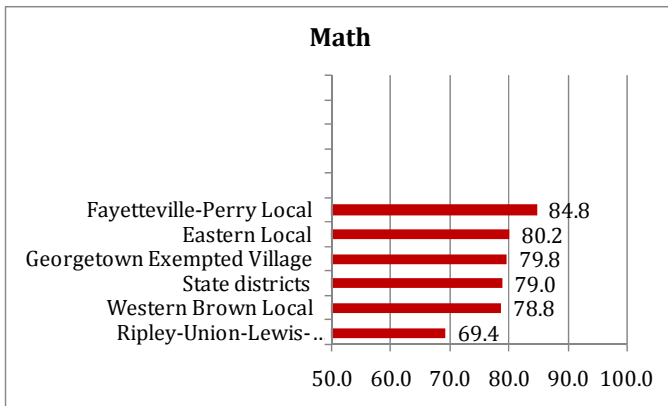
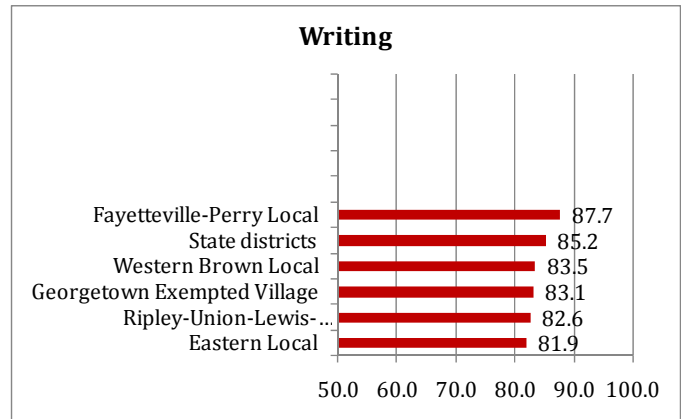
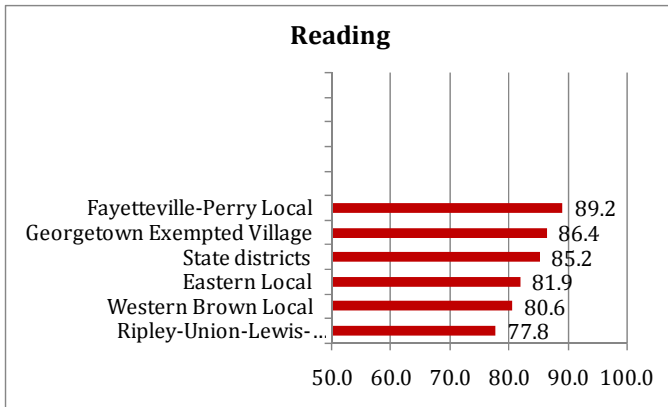
Taxable Value of Real Property³
