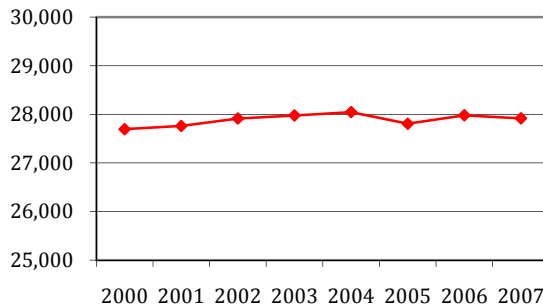

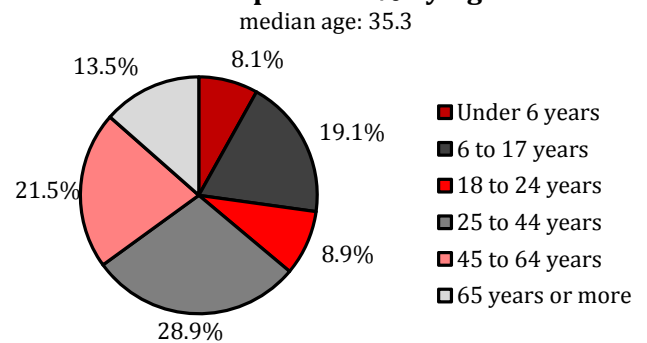


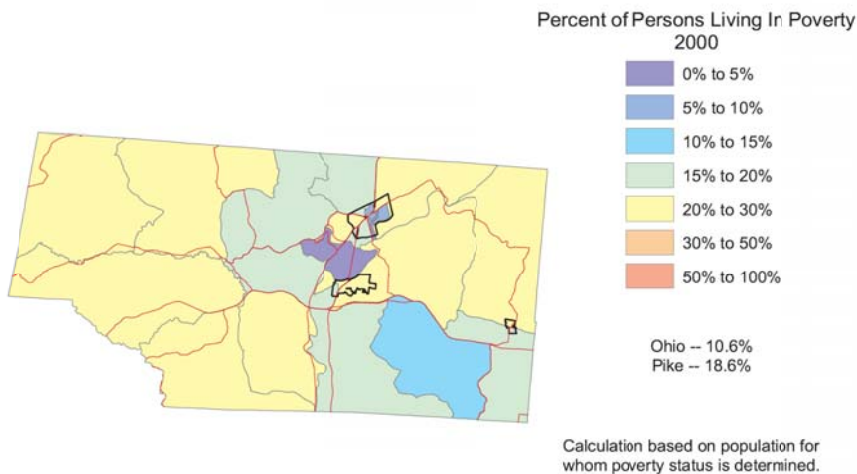

**2000 Population % by Age<sup>3</sup>**

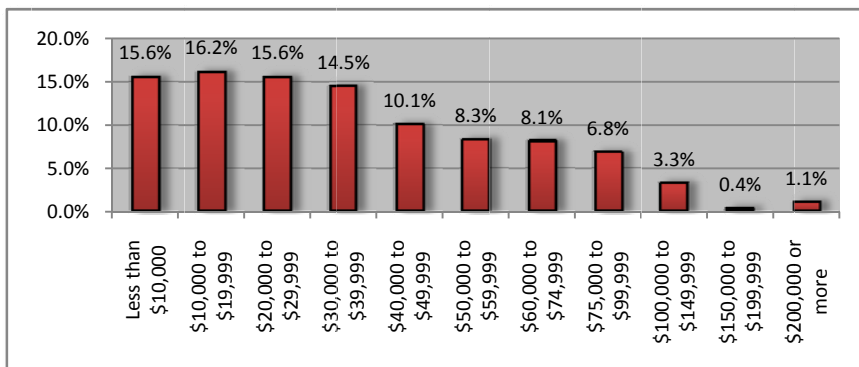




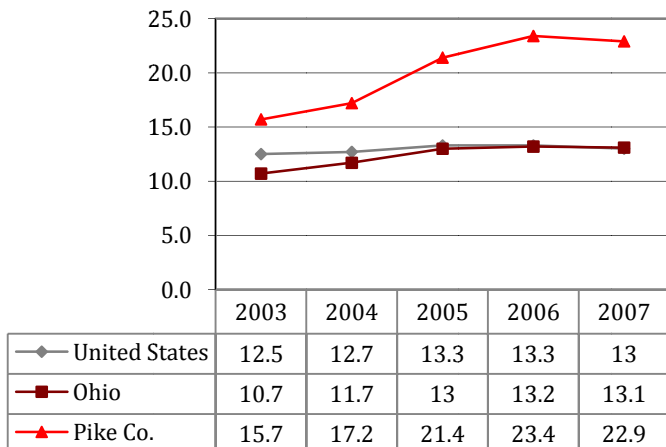

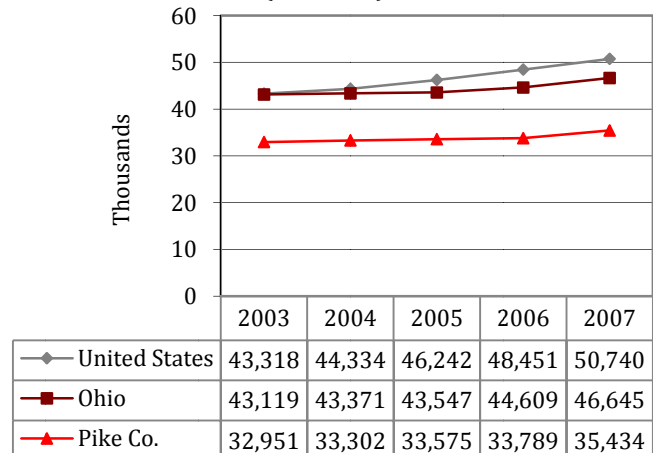
**Percent of Population by Household Income<sup>3</sup>**

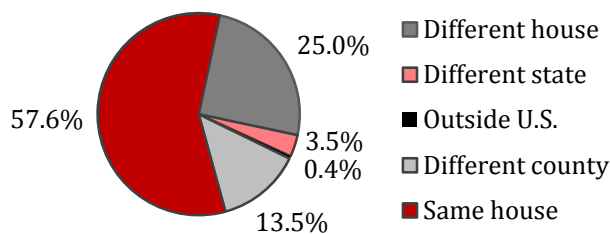

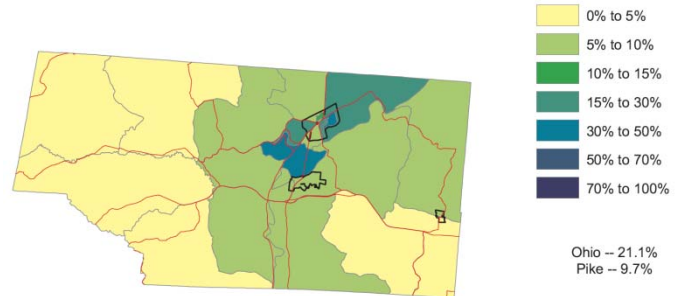

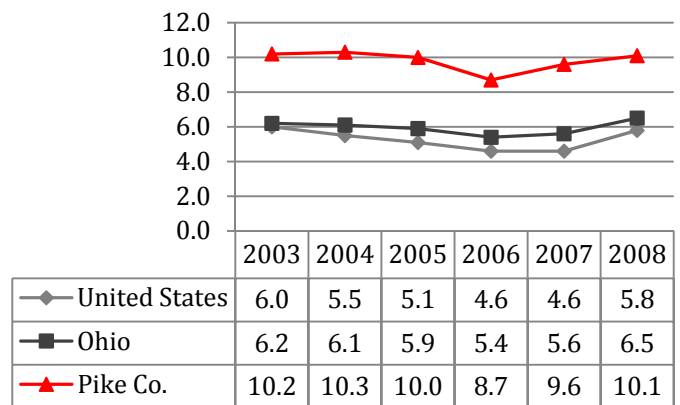

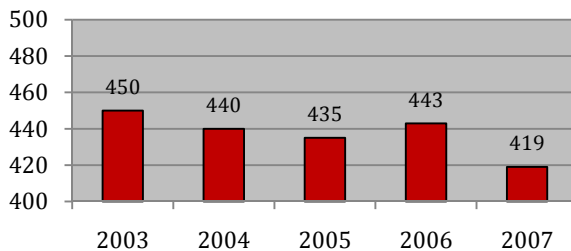

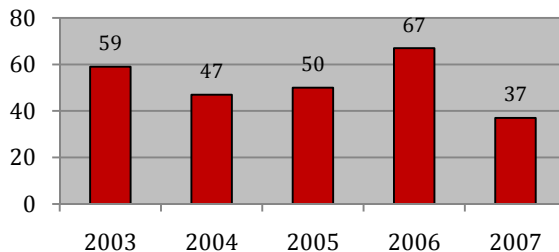

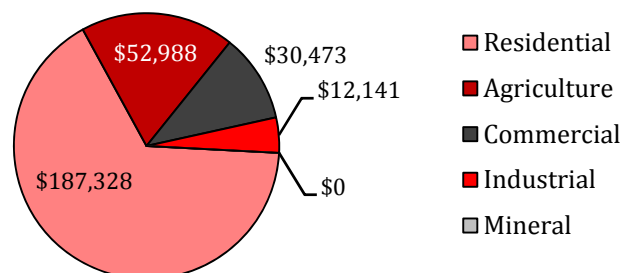
